

ADVOCACY

- 0181 One of the School Board's important functions is to serve as an advocate for the School District and advocate for public education and educational excellence and equity for all students. The Board's advocacy role includes regional, state, and national concerns.
- 0182 The School Board will pursue formal and planned advocacy activities as approved unanimously.
- 0183 The Board authorizes the Superintendent and Board President to occasionally structure portions of Board meetings as advocacy opportunities, including showcasing particular student and staff accomplishments, District programs, and District partnerships and by using meeting time to identify and address legislative and other advocacy opportunities. The Board will also consider the extent to which standing or ad hoc committees might be utilized to further the Board's advocacy.
- 0184 Specifically related to legislative and public policy issues, the Board seeks to proactively and reactively engage and advocate on behalf of the School District and its students with lawmakers, agency personnel, and other government officials. On matters of common concern, the Board will leverage the resources and activities of regional and state-wide associations that are pursuing shared interests and objectives.
