



Reporting of Communicable Diseases is required by Wisconsin State Statute 252.05 and Wisconsin Administrative Code HFS 145. Those required to report include: physicians, nurses, laboratory directors, school and daycare personnel and others.

Ozaukee County Public Health Department is the agency designated by state law to receive reports of communicable disease in Ozaukee County residents.

Reports can be phoned, faxed and/or mailed to the Ozaukee County Public Health Department. Once received, an investigation is conducted to determine the source of infection and to prevent further spread. Completed epidemiological reports are sent to the Wisconsin Division of Public Health for entry into the state network.

Ozaukee County Public Health Department maintains a county-wide communicable disease database, produces surveillance data and identifies communicable disease trends.

REPORTABLE COMMUNICABLE DISEASES

Category I: The following diseases are of urgent public health importance and shall be reported **IMMEDIATELY** to the patient's local health officer upon identification of a case or suspected case. In addition to the immediate report, complete and mail an Acute and Communicable Diseases Case Report (DOH 4151) to the address on the form **within 24 hours**. Public health intervention is expected as indicated. See s. HFS 145.04 (3) (a).

Category III: The following diseases shall be reported to the state epidemiologist on an AIDS Case Report (DOH 4264) or a Wisconsin Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Infection Confidential Case Report (DOH 4338) or by other means **within 72 hours** after identification of a case or suspected case. See s. 252.15 (7) (b), Stats., and s. HFS 145.04 (3) (b).

- Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS)^{1,2,4}
- Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection^{2,4}
- CD4 + T-lymphocyte count <200 µL, or CD4 + T-lymphocyte percentage of total lymphocytes of <14

¹ Infectious diseases designated as notifiable at the national level.

² Wisconsin or CDC follow-up form is required. Local health departments have templates of these forms in the Epinet manual.

³ High-risk assessment by local health department is needed to determine if patient or member of patient's household is employed in food handling, day care or health care.

⁴ Source investigation by local health department is needed.

⁵ Immediate treatment is recommended, i.e., antibiotic or biologic for the patient or contact or both.

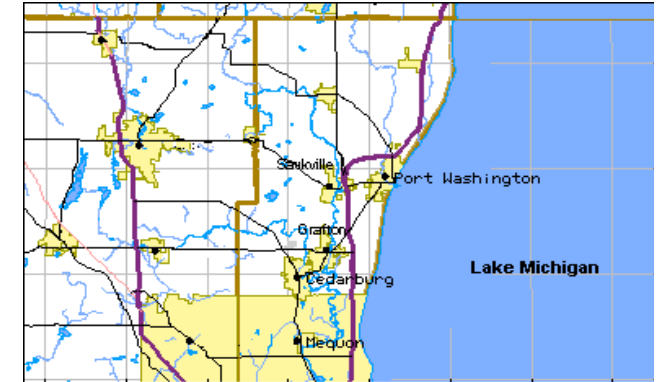
